



Thousands of families live in outlying areas such as the Galilee, Golan or the southern desert areas known as the "periphery." Most of these families have few financial resources and limited educational and social opportunities.

TAMIR is a nonprofit organization established in 2003 in the city of Katzrin situated on the Golan Heights, to embrace youth from outlying areas.

TAMIR's mission is to improve the social and economic status of Israelis in the periphery by instilling young people with self esteem and social responsibility. TAMIR trains leaders to become role models, infusing the next generation with motivation and a "can-do" attitude.

TAMIR operates in three major areas in order to reverse the path to failure of underprivileged youngsters from the periphery and to achieve long term improvement in their social environment:

A preparatory year ("Mechina") between high school completion and conscription to the army - TAMIR reaches out to army-bound teens, many of them at risk, inspiring them to develop inner strength and belief in their own worth. The majority of our graduates proceed to serve in the IDF with great distinction.

A post army leadership and teacher's training program - Veterans earn a bachelor's degree in education and train to become teachers specializing in children with difficulties in the periphery.

Outreach - TAMIR is building an Educational Center on campus as a base for informal educational programming. The Center is being established in memory of the 10 fallen soldiers at Bint J'Bel, Lebanon in 2006. These 10 young men embodied the very spirit of leadership, courage, striving for excellence and Zionist ideals. The Center will host groups and missions of young people living in Israel and around the world. Its programs will impart the values and character traits embodied by the 10 Israeli heroes.

TAMIR PREP-The "Mechina" year program

TAMIR PREP is a one year army preparatory program between high school and induction. It reduces social gaps and empowers each participant to establish and reach his personal goals. The program already has 550 graduates, all having honorably completed their military service - none of whom would have achieved these results before joining TAMIR PREP.

TAMIR PREP transforms indifferent youth into committed and responsible adults. TAMIR gives students the tools to become army officers and assume leadership roles in the community through:

- Intensive Jewish and Zionist education and an emphasis on collective responsibility
- **Giving back to the community** by volunteering to help children and the elderly, including Holocaust survivors
- A rigorous physical fitness program to better build physical and emotional strength, perseverance and determination
- Motivational and self-empowerment seminars and experiences
- Close cooperation with the army to carefully place program participants in an appropriate framework

The Makings of a War Hero





Avichai Yaakov was orphaned from his father when he was only a month old and grew up in Netua, near the Lebanese border. TAMIR PREP followed high school graduation and was a turning point in Avichai's life. He gained confidence and leadership skills and was well-prepared for officers training in the army.

Following a life-changing year at TAMIR, Avichai enlisted in the Golani Brigade determined to seek excellence in himself and soon after, from the soldiers under his command.

During the Second Lebanon War, Avichai battled side by side with Roee Klein, his heroic commander. Roee sacrificed his life by throwing himself on a grenade to save his men. Avichai assumed command, returned fire and safely evacuated all the fallen and wounded from the battleground, while under heavy fire. He repeatedly endangered his own life to protect others.

Avichai Yaakov was awarded one of Israel's highest awards for bravery, the "Ittur Ha'Oz." He returned to TAMIR with the determination and commitment to complete the Educational Leadership Program.

Avichai is married with four children and is now the Executive Director of TAMIR, leading disadvantaged youth to better lives.

BACK HOME-Teacher's Training

Children raised in the periphery face a substantially higher chance of becoming at-risk, due to the minimal educational, social and financial resources available. 33% of Israeli children are raised in poverty. From a young age, many are alienated and behavioral symptoms such as vagrancy, vandalism, drug abuse and violence often ensue. School work suffers. Many of these children grow up not believing in their own abilities or potential.

Following army service, the TAMIR northern campus in Katzrin offers the "BACK HOME" Teacher's Training leadership program. Participants study in a dual Judaic studies/education program and earn a Bachelor's degree in education combined with practical experience in local and regional schools. Their training schedule includes weekly volunteering in the city of Katzrin with school children and with the elderly.

Graduates are placed in jobs in or near their home towns. They are committed to conveying the ideals, skills and motivation they gained from TAMIR and from the army to their young charges. TAMIR-trained teachers are role models who motivate children through personal example.

Changing the Face of Society

TAMIR has established an outreach program that aims to level many social inequalities in Israel.

The center will be a base for programs and activities, for reaching out to Israeli youth, soldiers and international groups of students and young adults - to instill in them the values of courage, excellence and Zionism.



Educational Center Capital Campaign

The TAMIR Study Hall will be built in memory of the ten soldiers who fell fighting for Israel's existence in the Battle of Bint J'Bel, Lebanon, in 2006. TAMIR has launched a \$980,000 campaign to build a 4,500 sq. ft central study hall with a capacity of 150 that will serve all TAMIR programs on the three acre campus in Katzrin.
