End-Of-Year Ceremony for our Graduating Mechina Class

Last June, we celebrated the end of the Mechina school year with our traditional End-Of-Year Ceremony, a kind of summarization and digestion of the journey the students and faculty embarked upon together over the last year. With parents and members of the Defense and Education Ministries in attendance, students took the podium and discussed what they learned about Judaism, Zionism, and about themselves over the past year. They focused not only on the past, but on the personal ramifications these changes mean for their future horizons, as well.



We're proud to welcome our new students this year. Thanks to so many generous people, the Mechina was able to expand its First-Year Program's enrollment from 45 to 60 students! Together with our 15 students in the Mechina's Second-Year Program, the Mechina now has the privilege of hosting a total of 75 students, including 17 students from new immigrant families. This success strengthens our ability to help brighten the futures of many more young men from around Israel, particularly from the peripheral and disadvantaged regions.

We would be delighted to see you share our successes next year as well.




